
The practical activities from the project were very interesting and through them, we learned new things about climate, global warming, how to help the planet become a better place, ecosystems and botany.

I enjoyed the city tour because it was conducted by students from the partner school specializing in Tourism. The students and teachers from this school were welcoming, smiling and pleasant.







This experience was wonderful because the teacher encouraged us to work as a team and showed us how to apply theoretical information to make it become something real.




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

The Portuguese students proved to be extremely sociable and welcoming, willing to answer any curiosities we had and help us feel at home as much as possible.




